Sub : Setting up of the Junior Basic Training Institutions.

In continuation of Government Order No. 88-End (Rehab) dated the 16th March, 1966, the undersigned is directed to say that in accordance with the scheme under the Residuary problem of Behad Militation in West Bengal, the state Government formulated proposals for setting up new Junior Basic Training Institutes during the current financial year. The buildings of the institutions have been made ready for occupation.

Sanction of the Governor is now accorded to the setting up of 3 (three) Government managed Junior Basic Training Institutes and to the scale of re-cutting expenditure as shown in the annexure for each of the Junior Basic Training Institutes.

The three Jr. Basic Trg. Institutes will be located at the following places and each will provide for teaching of 80 trainees both male and female.

1. Bara Jagulia, Nadia.
2. Chhanderi, Bankura.
3. Radhanagar, Hooghly.

The Institutions will start functioning from the ensuing November session as residential institutions.

The Charge involved will be met from the provision under the head 'W'. Development schemes - Fourth five year plan - Elementary Education - Development of Teachers' Training facilities including Basic in the current year '86 10 - Education budget.

This order issues with the concurrence of the Finance Department vide their U.O.No. BVI 2335 dated the 11th September, 68.

It may also be confirmed if the deed of gift in respect of the land has been duly registered by the donors as has already been asked in para 3 of this office memo, no. 1033/1(7) SC/P(II) dated 18. 3. 68.

4. An inventory may please be prepared in respect of the furniture, equipment and books for which a total grant of Rs. 34,600/- was already placed inter - alia with respective sponsoring Authorities. If the articles were purchased in part only the society concerned as per approved list of this of this Directorate.

5. Necessary steps have been taken for issue of advertisement in the newspapers for admission of trainees. A copy has been duly endorsed to him with this office memo, no. 5364/1(6) SC/P (II) dt. 30.10.68. He is, therefore requested to collect the applications of the outsider candidates who will address him direct and dispose of such applications received on or before 23.11.68. in the manner detailed in this office circular mentioned above. The college will be a co-educational one with 80 residential trainees, 20 of whom would be ladies.

6. Steps are also being taken from this end for posting of teaching staff ( including clerks & librarians ) in the Junior Basic Training Institute in question. A separate communication will follow in this respect.

7. He is to see that the establishment peons and servants as sanctioned in the Govt., Order are immediately recruited. One Medical Officer ( Part-time ) is also to be appointed in college, with the approval of the Directorate. All steps should be taken to start the college by the first week of December, 1968. at the latest. The date for formal inauguration of the college may please be reported to this office in due course.

8. Notwithstanding the provisions made in the G.O. No. 1087-Edn(P) dt. 16.10.68 for holding of Refresher course of the Ex-trainees the said course need not be arranged and no expenditure should be incurred on the course on the basis of the revised policy of Govt. in this regard. As regards other items of expenditure including stipends of the trainees expenditure as per approved rate laid down in the Govt. order quoted above may be incurred by him and necessary allotment covering the total expenditure will be duly placed with him on receipt of Budget of the Institute for the year 1968-69.
